McCloud guidance examples – applying McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out

These examples have been prepared for use by the scheme administrator to demonstrate the calculations set out in the *Guidance for applying McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out* guidance note, dated 23 February 2024 (referred to as the 'McCloud guidance note' in these examples). These examples should be read in conjunction with that guidance note.

These examples on applying McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out depend on calculating non-Club transfers out from the legacy schemes and the reformed scheme. Guidance and examples on these calculations are set out in non-Club transfers out guidance notes for those schemes, as referenced in the McCloud guidance note.

This document includes:

- Example 1 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, all transferred benefits were Classic benefits
- Example 2 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, transferred remedy period benefits included a mix of Classic and alpha benefits
- Example 3 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, all transferred remedy period benefits were alpha benefits, alternative scheme is Premium
- Example 4 – Post-1 October 2023 CETV

These examples have been prepared for use by the scheme manager and scheme administrator of the Northern Ireland Civil Service Pension Scheme (the Scheme) for the purpose of applying the McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out paid by the Scheme. They were commissioned by



the scheme manager, and were prepared by GAD in our role advising the scheme manager on the Scheme.

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Example 1 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, all transferred benefits were Classic benefits

Data required for remedy calculations

The benefit amounts and original CETV calculated shown above are in respect of all of the member's transferred benefits. Information on the benefits earned by the member in the remedy period as if they were earned only in the legacy scheme and only in the reformed scheme is required:

In addition, information on the actual benefit amounts accrued in the remedy period in each scheme, as allowed for in the original calculations, is required. In this case the actual benefits accrued in the remedy period are equal to the 'legacy scheme' benefits above.

Factors required

The following table sets out the factors that would apply to the CETV calculation if it were to be calculated under the legacy scheme and the reformed scheme respectively. These are based on the factors effective at the original calculation date. Further information on the relevant factors to adopt are set out in the referenced guidance notes.

Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

Legacy scheme transfer value =

$$= P^L \times F^{P_L_60} + S^L \times F^{S_L_60} + LS^L \times F^{LS_L_60} - NI^L \times F^{NI_L_60}$$

$$= £1,800.00 \times 18.76 + £900.00 \times 1.98 + £5,400.00 \times 0.94 - £0.00 \times 13.15$$

$$= £40,626.00$$

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

alpha scheme transfer value =

$$= (P^R \times F^{P_R_67} + S^R \times F^{S_R_67}) \times F^{Reval_R_67}$$

$$= (£3,300.00 \times 10.64 + £1,237.50 \times 1.70) \times 1.20$$

$$= £44,658.90$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

All of the member's remedy period benefits were accrued in the legacy scheme. Therefore, the remediable transfer value paid is equal to the Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme as calculated above, i.e. £40,626.00.

Remedy amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the alpha scheme is compared to the value of the remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

$$\text{Additional CETV following remedy} = \text{Max} (£40,626.00, £44,658.90) - £40,626.00 = £4,032.90$$

This amount is calculated as at 1 December 2019. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

Example 2 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, transferred remedy period benefits included a mix of Classic and alpha benefits

Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

Legacy scheme transfer value =

$$= P^L \times F^{P_L_60} + S^L \times F^{S_L_60} + LS^L \times F^{LS_L_60} - NI^L \times F^{NI_L_60}$$

$$= £2,650.00 \times 17.89 + £1,325.00 \times 1.95 + £7,950.00 \times 0.90 - £0.00 \times 13.25$$

$$= £57,147.25$$

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

alpha scheme transfer value =

$$\begin{aligned} &= (P^R \times F^{P_R_67} + S^R \times F^{S_R_67}) \times F^{\text{Reval_R_67}} \\ &= (£4,900.00 \times 9.77 + £1,837.50 \times 1.60) \times 1.27 \\ &= £64,532.51 \end{aligned}$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

The member had both Classic and alpha benefits in the remedy period. Therefore the remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated allowing for the part of the remedy period in relation to legacy scheme benefits and the part of the remedy period in relation to reformed scheme benefits as follows.

Portion of remediable transfer value paid (legacy) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= P^{\text{Actual_L}} \times F^{P_L_60} + S^{\text{Actual_L}} \times F^{S_L_60} + LS^{\text{Actual_L}} \times F^{LS_L_60} - NI^{\text{Actual_L}} \times F^{NI_L_60} \\ &= £750.00 \times 17.89 + £375.00 \times 1.95 + £2,250.00 \times 0.90 - £0.00 \times 13.25 \\ &= £16,173.75 \end{aligned}$$

Portion of remediable transfer value paid (reformed) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= (P^{\text{Actual_R}} \times F^{P_R_67} + S^{\text{Actual_R}} \times F^{S_R_67}) \times F^{\text{Reval_R_67}} \\ &= (£3,500.00 \times 9.77 + £1,312.50 \times 1.60) \times 1.27 \\ &= £46,094.65 \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{Total remediable transfer value paid} = £16,173.75 + £46,094.65$$

$$= £62,268.40$$

Remedy amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the alpha scheme is compared to the value of remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

$$\text{Max } (£57,147.25, £64,532.51) - £62,268.40 = £2,264.11$$

This amount is calculated as at 1 January 2020. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

Example 3 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, all transferred remedy period benefits were alpha benefits, alternative scheme is Premium

The benefit amounts and original CETV calculated shown above are in respect of all of the member's transferred benefits. Information on the benefits earned by the member in the remedy period as if they were earned only in the legacy scheme and only in the reformed scheme is required:

Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

Legacy scheme transfer value =

$$\begin{aligned} &= P^L \times F^{P_L_60} + S^L \times F^{S_L_60} + LS^L \times F^{LS_L_60} - NI^L \times F^{NI_L_60} \\ &= £4,000.00 \times 15.94 + £1,500.00 \times 1.83 + £0.00 \times 0.80 - £0.00 \times 10.76 \\ &= £66,505.00 \end{aligned}$$

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

alpha scheme transfer value =

$$\begin{aligned} &= (P^R \times F^{P_R_67} + S^R \times F^{S_R_67}) \times F^{Reval_R_67} \\ &= (£5,600.00 \times 7.92 + £2,100.00 \times 1.36) \times 1.40 \\ &= £66,091.20 \end{aligned}$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

All of the member's remedy period benefits were accrued in alpha. Therefore, the remediable transfer value is equal to the Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme as calculated above, i.e. £66,091.20.

Remedy amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the alpha scheme is compared to the value of remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

$$\text{Max } (£66,505.00, £66,091.20) - £66,091.20 = £413.80$$

This amount is calculated as at 30 November 2018. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

Legacy scheme transfer value =

$$= P^L \times F^{P_L_60} + S^L \times F^{S_L_60} + LS^L \times F^{LS_L_60} - NI^L \times F^{NI_L_60}$$

$$= £2,800.00 \times 20.48 + £1,050.00 \times 2.36 + £0.00 \times 0.98 - £0.00 \times 0.00$$

$$= £59,822.00$$

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

alpha scheme transfer value =

$$= (P^R \times F_{P_R_67}^P + S^R \times F_{S_R_67}^S) \times F_{Reval_R_67}^{Reval}$$

$$= (£4,100.00 \times 12.03 + £1,537.50 \times 2.10) \times 1.17$$

$$= £61,485.55$$

Remedy amount

Higher of remediable transfer values = Max (£59,822.00, £61,485.55) = £61,485.55

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the alpha scheme should be included in the total transfer value to be paid (alongside the transfer value for benefits accrued before and after the remedy period).
