McCloud guidance examples – applying McCloud
remedy to non-Club transfers out

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Introduction

These examples have been prepared for use by the scheme administrator to demonstrate the calculations set out in the *Guidance for applying McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out* guidance note, dated 17 December 2024 (referred to as the 'McCloud guidance note' in these examples). These examples should be read in conjunction with that guidance note.

These examples on applying McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out depend on calculating non-Club transfers out from the legacy schemes and the reformed scheme. Guidance and examples on these calculations are set out in non-Club transfers out guidance notes for those schemes, as referenced in the *McCloud guidance note*.

Compliance and limitations

These examples have been prepared for use by the scheme manager and scheme administrator of the Police Pension Schemes (England and Wales) (the Scheme) for the purpose of applying the McCloud remedy to non-Club transfers out paid by the Scheme. They were commissioned by the Home Office as the responsible authority and were prepared by GAD in our role advising the responsible authority for the Scheme.

These examples may be published on the scheme manager, scheme administrator, HO and NPCC's websites.

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The contribution adjustment required should the member choose the reformed scheme, as calculated using the "McCloud tax and contributions calculator", is assumed to be as follows:

Reformed Scheme contribution adjustments (contadjR) = £1,100.00 (i.e. the Scheme owes the member)

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

2015 Scheme transfer value (CETV_R) =

$$= P^R \times F_{P_R_67}^P + S^R \times F_{S_R_67}^S$$

$$= £2,600.00 \times 12.84 + £1,300.00 \times 2.97$$

$$= £37,245.00$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid (CETV_Paid)

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

All of the member's remedy period benefits were accrued in the legacy scheme. Therefore, the remediable transfer value paid is equal to the Remediable transfer value under the relevant legacy scheme as calculated above, i.e. £48,360.00.

Remediable amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the 2015 Scheme, after allowing for any member contribution adjustment, is compared to the value of the remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

$$\text{Remediable amount} = \text{Maximum (CETV_L + contadjL, CETV_R + contadjR)} - \text{CETV_Paid}$$

$$= \text{Maximum (£48,360.00 + £0.00, £37,245.00 + £1,100.00)} - £48,360.00$$

$$= £0.00$$

This amount is calculated as at 1 December 2019. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the member's relevant legacy scheme:

$$= £2,160.00 \times 12.33 + £1,080.00 \times 2.68 + £8,640.00 \times 0.71$$

$$= £35,661.60$$

Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme

The contribution adjustment required should the member choose the reformed scheme, as calculated using the "McCloud tax and contributions calculator", is assumed to be as follows:

Reformed Scheme contribution adjustments (contadjR) = - £830.00 (i.e. the member owes the Scheme)

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

2015 Scheme transfer value (CETV_R) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= P^R \times F^{P_R_67} + S^R \times F^{S_R_67} \\ &= £2,700.00 \times 11.00 + £1,350.00 \times 2.70 \\ &= £33,345.00 \end{aligned}$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

The member had both 2006 Scheme and 2015 Scheme benefits in the remedy period. Therefore, the remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated allowing for the part of the remedy period in relation to legacy scheme benefits and the part of the remedy period in relation to reformed scheme benefits as follows.

Portion of remediable transfer value paid (legacy) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= P^{Actual_L} \times F^{P_L_65} + S^{Actual_L} \times F^{S_L_65} + LS^{Actual_L} \times F^{LS_L_65} + PP^{Actual_L} \times F^{C_L_2006} \\ &= £860.00 \times 12.33 + £430.00 \times 2.68 + £3,440.00 \times 0.71 \\ &= £14,198.60 \end{aligned}$$

Portion of remediable transfer value paid (reformed) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= P^{Actual_R} \times F^{P_R_67} + S^{Actual_R} \times F^{S_R_67} + PP^{Actual_R} \times F^{C_R_2015} \\ &= £1,600.00 \times 11.00 + £800.00 \times 2.70 \\ &= £19,760.00 \end{aligned}$$

Total remediable transfer value paid (CETV_Paid) =

$$\begin{aligned} &= £14,198.60 + £19,760.00 \\ &= £33,958.60 \end{aligned}$$

Remediable amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the 2015 Scheme, after allowing for any member contribution adjustment, is compared to the value of the remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

$$\begin{aligned}\text{Remediable amount} &= \text{Maximum (CETV}_L + \text{contadj}_L, \text{CETV}_R + \text{contadj}_R) - \text{CETV_Paid} \\ &= \text{Maximum (£35,661.60 + £1,300.00, £33,345.00 - £830.00)} - £33,958.60 \\ &= £3,003.00\end{aligned}$$

This amount is calculated as at 1 January 2020. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

Example 3 – Pre-1 October 2023 CETV, all transferred remedy period benefits were 2015 Scheme benefits, alternative scheme is 2006 Scheme

The contribution adjustment required should the member choose the reformed scheme, as calculated using the "McCloud tax and contributions calculator", is assumed to be as follows:

Reformed Scheme contribution adjustments ($contadjR$) = £0.00

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

2015 Scheme transfer value (CETV_R) =

$$= P^R \times F_{P_R_67}^P + S^R \times F_{S_R_67}^S$$

$$= £7,000.00 \times 10.10 + £3,500.00 \times 2.53$$

$$= £79,555.00$$

Value of remediable transfer value paid (CETV_Paid)

The remediable transfer value paid needs to be calculated, i.e. the part of the transfer value paid which relates to benefits accrued in the remedy period.

All of the member's remedy period benefits were accrued in 2015 Scheme. Therefore, the remediable transfer value is equal to the Remediable transfer value under the reformed scheme as calculated above, i.e. £79,555.00.

Remediable amount

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the 2015 Scheme, after allowing for any member contribution adjustment, is compared to the value of the remediable transfer value paid to determine whether any additional payment is due, i.e.

Remediable amount = Maximum (CETV_L + contadjL, CETV_R + contadjR) – CETV_Paid

$$= \text{Maximum } (£84,644.00 + £2,000.00, £79,555.00 + £0.00) - £79,555.00$$

$$= £7,089.00$$

This amount is calculated as at 30 November 2018. The relevant legislation sets out what the administrator must do with this additional CETV (including the application of interest as appropriate).

The CETV value of the member's remediable rights must be calculated as if they were secured in the reformed scheme:

2015 scheme transfer value (CETV_R) =

$$= P^R \times F^{P_R_68} + S^R \times F^{S_R_68}$$

$$= £1,800.00 \times 10.20 + £900.00 \times 3.01$$

$$= £21,069.00$$

Remedy amount

The CETV in respect of remediable service is calculated as follows:

Higher of remediable transfer values =

$$= \text{Maximum (CETV_L, CETV_R + contadjR)}$$

$$= \text{Max (£22,421.00, £21,069.00 - £2,600.00)} = £22,421.00$$

The higher of the remediable transfer value under the legacy scheme and the remediable transfer value under the 2015 Scheme, after allowing for any reformed scheme member contribution adjustment, should be included in the total transfer value to be paid (alongside the transfer value for benefits accrued before and after the remedy period).
